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

TENSION:

14 htr x 12 rows= 10x 10 cm

ABBREVIATIONS: (UK TERMS)

Ch - Chain St - Stitch Beg - Beginning RS - right side WS - wrong side BLO - Back loop only SI st - Slip stitch Dc - double crochet Htr - Half treble Tr - treble- (Dc) Double crochet PICOT: 3 ch, sl st in 3rd ch from hook: picot made. SHELL: In specified st work (3 tr, work picot, 3 tr): shell made.

Unused loops: This is the front loop after the half treble in the back loop (row 5). The unused loops of the stitches will be on the right side of your work.

NOTES ON PATTERN:

• The blanket is worked in rows in one piece. The waves will be worked once the base is completed.

• You can make your blanket bigger or smaller. Your starting chain should be a multiple of 6 +3 (for example, 75, 81, 87, 93 and so on) for the width, and for the length repeat rows 1-5 until you reach your desired measurement, then add 3 more rows of htr.

• A simple border will be added after the full blanket is completed.

• I highly recommend weaving in your ends after each row when working the waves.

Using 5mm crochet hook, chain 130.

Row 1: Starting in 2nd ch from hook, htr in each ch, 1 ch, turn. 129 sts
Row 2: Htr in each st, 1 ch (doesn't count as a stitch here), turn. 129 sts
Rows 3-4: Htr in each st, 1 ch, turn.
Row 5: Htr in BLO across, 1 ch, turn
Rows 6- 139: Repeat rows 1- 5
Rows 140-142: Htr in each sts. Fasten off.

WAVES

With right side facing you, turn piece upside down. Starting at bottom, working in unused loops of each row 5 of base, work a shell row. Shell row

Join colour B, in unused loop at right, 1 ch, 1 dc in next 2 sts, miss 2 sts, *shell in next st, miss 2 sts, 2 dc in next 2 sts* repeat from * to last 2 sts, 2 dc in last 2 sts. Fasten off.

Repeat this shell row in every row 5 of htr in BLO.

Lightly steam each shell row if needed to keep shells flat.

BORDER

Rnd 1: Attach colour A to right bottom edge, 2 ch, miss 1 sp, *1 dc, miss 1 space*, repeat from * until you reach the first corner, 1 dc, 1 ch, 1 dc in corner space, miss 1 space, *1 dc, miss 1 space, 1 dc * repeat from * along the border of the blanket, work (1 dc, 1 ch, 1 dc) in each corner space, sl st in 1st ch of beg ch 2. Fasten off.

Rnd 2: Attach colour B, and repeat rnd 1. Fasten off

WASHING INSTRUCTIONS

All our threads are produced in accordance with Oeko-Tex standards. PH values are tested and all our colour dye lots adhere to Global fastness standards. However, it is important to follow our thread washing instructions. Particularly with dark colors, excess dye can remain on the thread. To minimise any potential bleeding of excess dyestuff it is important to wash the products in THE HOTTEST TEMPERATURE possible, in accordance with the specifications of the fabrics, and use a large amount of water. Please make sure that you also follow the fabric washing instructions where appropriate. As a precaution, you can also use decolorating sheets that you can find in any supermarket.
